1. Introduction and apologies

David Edmonds welcomed members to the 78th ILP meeting

2. Review of actions

The actions from the last meeting have been completed and the minutes were approved.

3. Focus on topic

3.1 Code 15 update

The Executive reported on progress of Code 15 since March 2022.

Code 15 is now in force, and implementation has gone well. The effort made by industry to get ready for implementation was noted and appreciated.

Code 3.13 was revised after publication. Section 3.13 relates to competitions and voting, including broadcasting competitions. Consultation with industry resulted in revised provisions coming into effect on 18 May.

PSA is currently working on a general permission for virtual chat receipting, and an informal roundtable was held on 15 June to consider options. A consultation is due to be published in the coming weeks.

It was noted these two examples demonstrate the flexibility permitted by Code 15.

The organisational restructure has been completed successfully supporting a smooth implementation process.

Industry reported concern around publication of open enforcement cases. The Executive explained that this is common practice among regulators including Ofcom. In cases where the outcome is that no further action should be taken, a notification will be posted online, and the case later removed from the open enforcement cases page.

Aimm commented it was carrying out a range of work to support members with compliance with Code 15, and training materials have been drafted. Aimm requested PSA to look over the training material to ensure it is comprehensive.

ACTION: the Executive to circulate the series of Consumer Awareness videos.

ACTION: aimm to send the training materials for review by the Executive.

4. Market Issues

The Executive provided an update on market issues, noting that the key metrics were showing the same consistent pattern of low contact and complaint volumes. The main key issue in the market remains ICSS.

5. PSA Update



An update was provided to the group by the Chief Executive and the Ofcom representative with key points as follows:

Following the announcement on the future of regulation, discussions on transfer of PSA regulation to Ofcom are progressing.

Regulation under PSA will continue up until transfer; any enforcement work outstanding after the transfer will continue under Ofcom.

Funding arrangements: the levy model will continue up until the point of transfer; Ofcom's proposed funding arrangements will be included as part of their consultation process. For 23/24, PSA will present a Business Plan and Budget that recognises and allows for flexibility around the transfer date during the year. It is expected that the usual consultation timetable will be followed.

The high-level timelines were shared with the ILP.

An in-person Industry Forum is being planned for October.
